AAA is seeking a Project Researcher to be based in Hong Kong on a one year contract with a possibility of extension subject to project requirements and individual performance. We offer a dynamic and intellectually stimulating environment providing opportunities for professional growth and development. This position offers a unique opportunity to contribute to the production of a publication focusing on Chinese contemporary art in the 21st Century. As a Project Researcher, you will play a pivotal role in conducting research, organizing forums, providing editorial support, managing project progress, and coordinating communications between AAA and relevant stakeholders.

Responsibilities:

- Conduct Research: Conduct archival, contextual, and image research in support of the book project.
- Forum Logistics: Manage logistical aspects to organise forums associated with the project
- Editorial Support: Provide editorial support, including transcription, translation, and copywriting.
- Project Management: Take responsibility for managing and reporting on the progress of the project.
- Coordination: Coordinate communications between AAA and various parties involved in the project.
